

Super Bowl 2011: Join CSA in Stopping Trafficking of Women and Children

The Green Bay Packers are playing in the Super Bowl and CSA along with the Wisconsin congregation of women religious are excited for them. They are also advocating to stop the practice of the human trafficking of hundreds of women and children who will be taken to Dallas, TX for the sole purpose of sexual exploitation.

Actions so far include:

- twelve congregations of WI women religious have sent letters to each Green Bay Packer player asking for their support to stop the practice of human trafficking.
- sent letters to the Packer administration, the Super Bowl Host Committee and the Mayor of Dallas, TX requesting their commitment to ending the practice of human trafficking at the Super Bowl Game.
- sent letters to Wisconsin Bishops asking for a public statement against trafficking
- Corresponded with the Packer chaplain, Father Jim Baraniak, who will include a petition in the Prayer of the Faithful at the liturgy with Packer players.
- The congregations of women religious in Texas have called the Dallas hotels asking them to train their staffs to report suspected cases of human trafficking.
