We may be *Ordinary Sisters*, the title given to our history as described by Sister Margaret Lorimer, yet we have encountered extraordinary opportunities that needed an enriching individual or group intervention. This has been my experience throughout the 60 years of consecrated life as a Sister of St. Agnes.
