# Introducing ISH

Home for Ismaila Jarju, simply known as 'Ish', and his mother Fatou, is Gambia West Africa.

In 2012 the Jarju family encountered two new next-door-neighbors, Justin and Sara Jewett; both US Peace Corps workers. The families became very close quickly, thanks to the Jewett's newly formed 501(c) (3) organization called "Ascend Kids" and Ish's goal of "someday being able to kick a soccer ball." He had been born with a congenital spinal deformity and Ascend strives to advance opportunities for the disabled and others to have access to resources that enable them to live a normal and healthy life.



Thanks to a very strong set of connections and perseverance the Jewetts' made dozens of phone

calls, and in turn dozens of consultations were made in Africa with doctors and surgeons. Other invaluable information was uncovered as well.

The first surgery performed allowed Ish to place his feet flat on the ground, but serious considerations remained. The spinal column was seriously compromised and he was losing all ability to walk.



Complex networking across continents brought word that Ish's condition was repairable and should be addressed to prevent further neurologic loss. A neurosurgeon or a surgeon versed in orthopedics was required. Thanks to prayers and persistence, operations did take place. But before they did, the Jarjus' spent some time in NY and stayed at The Leo House,

thanks to the special rate for those with medical needs. They had consultations here in the city, but Ish's bright eyes, high energy, and constant curiosity had us captivated. The business center was never busier, and drawing paper was in high demand; he felt right at home during their brief stay, and his art work was outstanding!

The Leo House provided a 'Go-Green' car for the drive to NJ to pick up the car-rental for further travel. The car journey to Chicago took them to the Ronald McDonald House, located on the Loyola campus where they are guests, and to Shriner's Hospital where the needed specialized surgeries would take place. A one-sentence note of gratitude sent recently by a Leo House Friend sums up the gratitude for the work of these three generous helpers:

"Great gratitude for your kind presence in our world."

To date we have learned that Ish has had more surgeries at Shriners, he is learning to walk and is benefiting most from work on parallel bars over a walker!

And his love of and high energy for art continues; it follows Ish

wherever he goes. This past December the hospital featured Ish and his artwork in Shriner's Christmas mailings to the wider world.

Thank you, Justin and Sara Jewett, for sharing Ish and Fatou with The Leo House community, and for being part of the Leo House Spring mailing.




#### Another *Note* of Thanks

The doors of The Leo House opened in 1889 to immigrants who were arriving in waves from Germany. That was 130 years ago, and The Leo House is proud to be one of the only original businesses still operating in the city today as a guesthouse.

The Sisters of Saint Agnes, likewise, acknowledge the 130th Anniversary of The Leo House and take pride in having been its caretakers all these years and for engaging in its mission of hospitality.

CSA presence in NY was significant prior to 1980. Besides members staffing The Leo House, teachers staffed the high school at Sacred Heart Parish in Yonkers, and its grammar school, Holy Family School on Castle Hill Avenue in the Bronx, and starting in 1885, Our Lady Queen of Angles School in East Harlem.

Currently four Sisters reside at The Leo House and they are: Sisters Vicki Wuolle, Pat Hayes, Marilyn Ellickson, and Joann Sambs.
