

# The Congregation of Sisters of St. Agnes Laudato Si' Action Platform Year Four Plan – DRAFT January 1 – December 31, 2025

The **Response to the Cry of Earth** is a call to protect our common home for the wellbeing of all, as we equitably address the climate crisis, biodiversity loss, and ecological sustainability.

Actions could include:

- the adoption of renewable energies and energy sufficiency measures
- achieving carbon neutrality, protecting biodiversity
- promoting sustainable agriculture
- guaranteeing access to clean water for all

The **Response to the Cry of the Poor** is a call to promote eco-justice, aware that we are called to defend human life from conception to death, and all forms of life on Earth.

Actions could include:

- projects to promote solidarity, with special attention given to vulnerable groups such as indigenous communities, refugees, migrants, and children at risk
- analysis and improvement of social systems
- social service programs

**Ecological Economics** acknowledges that the economy is a sub-system of human society, which itself is embedded within the biosphere—our common home.

Actions could include:

- sustainable production and consumption
- ethical investments
- divestment from fossil fuels and any activity harmful to the planet and the people
- supporting circular economies
- prioritizing care labor and protecting the dignity of workers

The **Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles** is grounded in the idea of sufficiency and promoting sobriety in the use of resources and energy.

Actions could include:

- reducing waste and recycling
- adopting sustainable dietary habits (opting for a more plant-based diet and reducing meat consumption)
- greater use of public transport
- active mobility (walking, cycling)
- avoiding single use items (e.g. plastic, etc.).

**Ecological Education** is about re-thinking and re-designing curricular and institutional reform in the spirit of integral ecology in order to foster ecological awareness and transformative action.

Actions could include:

- ensuring equitable access to education for all and promoting human rights
- fostering Laudato Si' themes within the community
- encouraging ecological leadership (students, teachers)
- ecological restoration activities

**Ecological Spirituality** springs from a profound ecological conversion and helps us to "discover God in all things", both in the beauty of creation and in the sighs of the sick and the groans of the afflicted, aware that the life of the spirit is not dissociated from worldly realities.

Actions could include:

- promoting creation-based liturgical celebrations
- developing ecological catechesis
- developing ecological retreats and formation programs, etc.

Community resilience and empowerment envisage a synodal journey of community engagement and participatory action at various levels.

Actions could include:

- promoting advocacy and developing people's campaigns
- encouraging rootedness and a sense of belonging in local communities and neighborhood ecosystems

#### Goal 1: Increase Landfill Diversion Efforts

#### What will we do?

- 1. Because we lack 100% satisfaction with cost and service of current services with Denali/Organix, we will continue to explore alternative options that we can confidently recommend to other area stores and businesses.
- 2. Give retreatants the option to compost during their stay.
- 3. Provide outreach and encourage local schools, businesses, and churches to consider a landfill diversion program like ours or similar.
- 4. Share more information with the general public on the importance of Food Waste Reduction

#### How & when will we do it?

- 1. Tracy will explore Dinner Bell Farms
- 2. Chelsea will develop a procedure and brochure for hermitage retreatants.

#### PROGRESS/RESULTS:

- 1. The biodigester in Forest County near Potawatomi recently filed for a demolition permit with the DNR. They closed after 9 years due to COVID.
- 2. Dinner Bell Farms' composting service is not up and running yet and once it is, it will not be providing small volume, residential pick ups. Tracy presented other composting companies doing pickups in Sun Prairie and Green Bay area. She will pursue Green Box out of Sun Prairie.
- 3. Green Box quoted \$200/month for every-other-week pickups from a 64-gallon tote, but requires a contract and three more entities to also contract to make it worth the drive. Tracy and Peg will be meeting with: Hospice, SMSA, Marian, MPTC, and others.
- 4. Chelsea created a procedure and handout when offering retreatants a compost bucket when staying. She is getting a good response to this so far. Two buckets were initially purchased, but due to demand, two more were purchased so that all hermitages have the option.

# **Goal 2: Implement Sustainability Guidelines**

#### What will we do?

- 1. Create conversation guides for households to discuss their commitment level to Laudato Si'
- 2. Encourage monthly conversations on Laudato Si' topics
- 3. Continue reducing single-use plastics

- 8. Explore offering an Eco-Pilgrimage for Season of Creation
