Sister Anne Karlin, CSA (Sister John), 84, a resident and staff member of The Leo House in New York City died on Thursday evening, November 17, 2005, at Nazareth Center, 375 Gillett Street, in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, after a brief illness.

Sister Anne, one of fifteen children, was born December 22, 1920, in Catharine, Kansas, a daughter of Frank E. and Anna Mary Schmidt Karlin. Anne entered the Congregation of St. Agnes in 1945 and professed her vows on August 15, 1948.



Eventually she would be one of six members of her family who joined religious life, with five joining the Congregation of St. Agnes in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

Throughout Sister Anne's life she had a special love for music. While in New York she had been a member of St. Patrick's Cathedral Choir and until recently an active member of the New York Grand Opera Chorus.

Survivors include her brother Francis Karlin of North Las Vegas, Nevada; three sisters, Teckla Werth and Isabelle Linenberger both of Los Angeles, California, and Sister Lois Karlin, CSA, of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin; four sisters-in-law, Agnes and Alfreda Karlin, both of Hays, Kansas, Carol Karlin of Grinnell, Kansas, and Vivian Karlin of Kansas City, Kansas. She is also survived by many nieces, nephews, grandnieces, grandnephews, and the members of the Congregation of St. Agnes with whom she lived and ministered.

Sister Anne was preceded in death by seven brothers: Alvin, Benno, Marne, Cletus, Eugene, Wilfric and Rev. Paulinus Karlin, O.F.M. Cap., and by three sisters: Sister Mary Catherine Karlin, CSA, Sister Francis Ann Karlin, CSA, and Sister Marcella Karlin, CSA.
